## Historical Note

*International Quarterly* was a political student publication that was produced in the years 1983-1991. It was founded by Alexei Cowett '85 and George Larkin '85. Other original members include Yong Kim '85, Mark Wasserberger '85, and Todd Eckler '86, and original faculty advisors include Robert Larkin, Charles Mott, and Larry Boyle. The inaugural issue's masthead reads: "This organization wishes to expose the reader to a diversity of viewpoints in order to create a forum for perspectives on the state of this world."

The magazine consists of editorials on current events of the time, satirical cartoons, and student polls. Cowett stated in a *Scroll* interview from 1983: "We hope the paper will fill a void which exists in the Deerfield community concerning international affairs and relations. In publishing the paper, we want to present both sides of an issue, and we will thus encourage students, faculty, and other interested parties to submit opposing views..."

This collection may be useful to anyone interested in current events of the 1980s and early 1990s as seen through the lens of the Deerfield Academy student body.
