

Chandler Bigelow III was Executive Vice President & Chief Financial Officer of Tribune Media Company (NYSE: TRCO) from 2016 until 2019 when the Company was sold to Nexstar Media Group. Prior to that he was Chief Business Strategies & Operations Officer of Tribune Media Company from 2013 – 2016 and Chief Financial Officer of Tribune Company from 2008 – 2013. He spent 21 years at Tribune, working for multiple CEOs, and was an officer of the parent company for 18 years.

While at Tribune, he served as a member of the Board of Directors of two leading digital media companies, CareerBuilder and Classified Ventures (Cars.com and Apartments.com), and served on the Management Committee of two highly successful cable television networks, TV Food Network and The Cooking Channel.

During his career at Tribune, Bigelow was involved in over \$50 billion of transactions and played a key role in many of the Company's largest and most important transactions, including the Company's "go private" leveraged buyout in 2007, its emergence from bankruptcy in 2012, the acquisition of Local TV in 2013, the spin-off of the Company's newspaper publishing operations in 2014, the acquisition of Gracenote in 2014 and the Company's ultimate sale to Nexstar in 2019.

While the Company's CFO, Bigelow oversaw and was responsible for all Corporate Finance activities (treasury, pension and risk management, financial reporting, SEC reporting/compliance, internal audit and tax), Investor Relations (equity, debt and rating agencies) and Technology/IT. In addition, he oversaw the Company's equity investments and real estate holdings which, at one time, included assets valued at over \$3 billion. As the Company's Chief Business Strategies & Operations Officer, he helped lead Tribune's strategic transformation from a predominately slow-to-no growth, large-market newspaper company to a growing and diversified television, entertainment and digital company culminating with a listing on the New York Stock Exchange in 2014. In addition, he led the Company's effort to form its Digital & Data segment which became the largest entertainment data company in the world.

Prior to Tribune, Bigelow worked in the finance department of Spyglass, Inc., one of the first publicly traded internet software companies, from 1996 to 1997. In 1994, he co-founded Brainerd Communicators, Inc., a successful investor relations firm based in New York, where he served as Vice President through 1995.

A native of New York City, Bigelow holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in English from Trinity College in Hartford, Connecticut and a Master of Business Administration degree in Finance from the University of Wisconsin in Madison. He is a Board Member of the Guild of the Chicago Botanic Garden and the Springboard Foundation in Chicago and he is a former Board Member of the Music Institute of Chicago. He lives in outside of Chicago with his wife and daughter and has two sons in college.
