Biographical Note

Jennie Maria Arms Sheldon was a scientist, suffragette, naturalist, and historian, as well as a benefactor and trustee (1913-1938) of Deerfield Academy. Born in 1852 in Bellows Falls, VT, she lived with her aunt in Deerfield from 1857-1859, after the death of her mother. She then moved to Greenfield where she lived and went to school until 1873, when she went to Boston and attended Mrs. Ada Shepard Badger's school for young women. In 1876, she became one of the first women to attend the MIT Women's Laboratory. Although she did not finish her degree, she met her mentor, zoologist and paleontologist Professor Alpheus Hyatt, and became a special student and assistant in the laboratory of the Boston Society of Natural History (now the Boston Museum of Science). She assisted Hyatt, lectured, taught at various schools, and worked at the museum until 1906, when she moved with her husband George Sheldon (m. 1897) to his hometown of Deerfield. In 1912, she became curator and president of the Pocumtuck Valley Memorial Association, and in 1913 a trustee of Deerfield Academy. In 1930, she donated \$100,000 to build the Arms Building, in memory of her father George Albert Arms. She died in 1938.

Scope and Content

The Jennie Maria Arms Sheldon Papers span the years 1900-2002 and consist mainly of correspondence to Frank L. Boyden. The letters document a friendship, a business relationship, and a deep interest and commitment to education for young people. Also included are scientific and historic publications written by Sheldon as well as various biographical material.
