



# DEERFIELD ACADEMY

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Deerfield Academy was chartered in 1797 to serve the local population of a rural village in Western Massachusetts. Since the 1920s, it has been wholly independent and committed to excellence in a full liberal arts curriculum and wholesome community life for young people from throughout the United States and around the world in grades nine through postgraduate. Deerfield's Core Values include citizenship, face-to-face interactions, connectedness, reflection and balance, pursuit of mastery, and shared experiences.

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### ENROLLMENT:

- 650 students: 75 day students and 575 boarding students
- 32 states, District of Columbia, and 44 foreign countries represented
- 13% international students
- 38% receive financial aid
- 200 seniors in the Class of 2026

### ACADEMIC CALENDAR AND PROGRAM:

- Trimester system and, as such, we do not have typical first quarter or midyear grades. Fall Term grades are available after Thanksgiving. **Colleges will receive Fall Term grades for all senior applicants and those should be used as a student's "midyear" grades**
- Six-period rotating block with three 90-minute classes per day
- Students take five graded seminar-style classes each trimester; advanced students may be granted permission to take a sixth graded class. Any student can choose to take a fine or performing arts course as a sixth pass/fail class
- Many classes are year-long, while others are one- or two-trimester electives
- Average class size: 12
- Academic work is evaluated on a numerical scale (0-100) where the minimum passing grade is 60
- Term cumulative grade averages for the term of 90.0 or above garner Honors distinction and 93.0 or above garner High Honors distinction
- **One hundred percent of our graduates ultimately attend four-year colleges and universities**

### CURRICULUM:

All of Deerfield's courses should be viewed as challenging and college preparatory. Many classes use college-level texts and match the pace of an undergraduate college course; others are post-AP level and the Honors or AP-course is the prerequisite. Over the past several years, Deerfield has moved away from teaching AP courses; we currently only offer official AP courses in math and the arts, along with an AP Seminar. All world language courses, except those in Latin and Arabic, are conducted exclusively in the target language. As a result, some students find the adjustment to language classes at Deerfield to be difficult, and our placement of new students may reflect that.

### Cocurricular activities:

- Required approximately two hours every weekday afternoon for faculty-supervised activity
- For most students, activities include an athletic commitment at the varsity, junior varsity, or recreational level, dance classes or theater rehearsals, or pursuing volunteer work through our community service program
- Some students receive permission to engage in special projects in art, music, or an academic field

### COURSE NUMBERING RUBRIC:

- 100-level typically for 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> graders or courses that are the first in a leveled sequence
- 200-level typically for 10<sup>th</sup> graders or courses that are the second in a leveled sequence
- 300-level typically for 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders or courses that are the third in a leveled sequence
- 400-level typically for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders or courses that are the fourth in a leveled sequence

## ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMINATIONS:

Although Deerfield only offers official AP courses in math, the arts, and AP seminar, students can choose to take an AP exam to demonstrate proficiency in a subject, even without officially taking an AP course. In the 2024–25 school year, 317 students sat for 718 AP exams. 95% of AP exams earned scores of 3 or higher:

Scores of 3 = 20%

Scores of 4 = 37%

Scores of 5 = 38%

## CLASSICAL STUDIES PROGRAM (CSP) & MUSIC DISTINCTION PROGRAMS:

The CSP is a distinction students can earn with the fulfillment of specific classics coursework (Latin Concentration or Classical Studies Concentration with Latin & Greek) along with a series of extracurricular commitments with the Classics Club. In meeting these requirements, a student has participated in a coherent academic experience that provides perspective and depth in the study of ancient literature and material culture. The Music Distinction Program recognizes students who have shown an exceptional dedication to the art of music making during their time at Deerfield Academy. Students earn this distinction with enrollment in music class all terms from 10<sup>th</sup>–12<sup>th</sup> grade and the completion of a Senior Capstone Music Project (e.g., recital, lecture, commercial EP release, composition portfolio, etc.)

## DISCIPLINARY DISCLOSURE POLICY:

Deerfield Academy's disciplinary system reflects the purposefully high behavioral and academic standards to which we hold our students. There are two components to reporting discipline—the institution and the student. Deerfield Academy has updated its institutional policy to the following: For as long as Deerfield Students are enrolled at the Academy, Deerfield will consider them in good standing and will not report internal disciplinary action to colleges, universities, and scholarship programs. If students withdraw pending discipline, are required to withdraw by the school, or otherwise officially separate from the school, Deerfield will communicate that change in status in a timely manner. As for the individual student, when an application asks whether a student has a disciplinary or academic infraction at any time during their high school career, the student will answer the question honestly.
